VOLUSIA COUNTY HOSPICE OPERATIONS

Halifax Health Center Hospice Liaison Nurse Cathy Gallagher, RN will present an overview of the Volusia County Hospice operations, how it is accessed, what it does, its staff and equipment and its record of success. This includes not just how it interfaces with the patient but how it works with and relates to the family and loved ones.

Cathy Gallagher was born and educated in NY State. In 1976 she came to Florida to attend Flagler College in St. Augustine. When she graduated she decided to stay in Florida because it is nice and warm. In 1999 she decided to become a Registered Nurse. While in Nursing School (1996-1999) she worked as a CNA for Hospice. After graduating from Nursing School, she worked for 2 years as an RN in the Oncology Dept of Halifax Health. In 2001 she rejoined the Hospice Program at Halifax Health as an Admissions Nurse.

For the past nine years, she has worked as a Community access Liaison which allows her to reach out and teach others about the benefits and helpfulness of hospice. Cathy is certified in hospice and palliative care nursing.

IEEE/IAS 2012 ELECTRICAL SAFETY WORKSHOP (ESW)

The Florida Council and the Daytona Section are supporting the Electrical Safety Workshop which will be held at the Daytona Hilton January 30 to February 3, 2012.

The primary mission of this Workshop is about path finding and creating the future in electrical safety by changing how we think about what is possible, or in other words, changing the electrical safety culture. The workshop goals are to:

- Accelerate application of breakthrough improvements in human factors, technology, and managing systems that reduce risk of electrical injuries.
- Stimulate innovation in overcoming barriers.
- Change and advance the electrical safety culture to enable sustainable

improvements in prevention of electrical accidents and injuries.

The mass market in electrical safety conferences is in the area of training and compliance with standards and regulations – helping people and organizations understand and apply current requirements. While this is essential in preventing electrical incidents and injuries, it is not the mission of ESW.

The Daytona Section has taken on several tasks for the Workshop:

- Organize and coordinate tours in the Daytona area for participants and companions (see ESW tours at http://ewh.ieee.org/r3/daytona/ESW2012.h tml)
- Provide support in manning the ESW conference booth.
- Staff a shared booth for the Daytona Section and the Industrial Applications Society during the workshop.

LIFE MEMBERS COMMITTEE - INTERNATIONAL SPEEDWAY TOUR

The LM Committee is sponsoring a Behind-the-Scenes Guided Tour of International Speedway in conjunction with the Electrical Safety Workshop on Monday morning, January 30, 2012. (Companions and families are welcome)

Daytona International Speedway is probably best known for hosting the Daytona 500 NASCAR race. The oval track is 2.5 miles long and is surrounded on three sides by stadiums that seat 168,000. Tunnels under the track provide access to the infield which houses the racing garages, drivers meeting room, supplier facilities and much more. The Daytona Speedway has what is believed to be the second largest outdoor lighting system in North America.

Our tour will begin at the front of the main Ticket and Tour building (near the Dale Earnhardt Sr. statue). From there our tourologist will take us to the infield of the Speedway where we will get a behind the scenes look at the Drivers Meeting Room, Gatorade Victory Lane, The NASCAR Sprint Cup Garages, Tech Inspection and more! Once we have completed the tour of the infield we

will precede to the Front stretch Sprint Tower and the France Family Suite where Sammy Wiggins of Economy Electric will talk to us about the electrical systems here at the World Center of Racing while we enjoy the view!

Life members wishing to participate in the tour should be at the Speedway main ticket and tour building by 9:15 a.m. on Monday, Jan. 30, 2012, and get signed in. The tour will start promptly at 9:30 a.m. and finish by 11:00 a.m. We have negotiated a special group rate of \$30.00 per person.

For members attending the conference and staying at the Daytona Hilton, transportation will be available to and from the speedway at a nominal cost.
