The Eastern NC Section has contributed richly to the IEEE and the industry. We have provided leadership at all levels of the IEEE, including one President (Dr. Troy Nagle, 1994) and one Executive VP, the last one to hold that position (George Abbott, 1989). We have also provided two Region 3 Directors, George Abbott, and of course our current Director, Mary Ellen Randall. Along with numerous leaders in the technical activities, publications, and standards areas, many NC Council Chairs have come from the ENCS including our current Chair, Paul Goodson.

We have also been a leader in conferences. The long-running regional conference, SoutheastCon, was born from a technical and student meeting in Raleigh (North Carolina Symposium and Exhibition) in 1965. Officially named SoutheastCon three years later, the conference has been hosted by our section in 1969, 1985, and 1995. We have also had other "firsts": In 1994, we held the first MPAC (Member Professional Activities Conference) in the IEEE. In 1997, we hosted the only SOUTHCON trade show ever held outside of Florida or Atlanta. The long-running North Carolina Symposium and Exhibition was hosted numerous times by our section.
