5,000 Attendees Expected at All Things Open 2019

In the third week of October, Raleigh Convention Center will host <u>All</u> <u>Things Open 2019</u>. This will be the seventh year for this annual technology convention. Over 240 sessions will be offered, split across tracks such as Big Data, Blockchain, Devops, Linux, Mobile Developer, Security, UI/UX/Design, Cloud, and Databases (see the <u>full list here</u>). These talks will be focused on education with an emphasis on understanding open source technologies and methodologies. See <u>6 Reasons You Should Attend ATO 2019</u> for more details.



IEEE ENCS appreciates the significance of open source technology. We will be present in support of ATO. Information about IEEE community volunteer projects, SoutheastCon 2020, and technical papers will be available.

The cost to attend varies depending on how early you register and which days you plan to attend. If you register during the month of September, the base price is \$149 per day or \$199 for both days. This includes access to all programing, networking socials, and lunch. A 20% discount is offered to IEEE members with discount code [IEEE20]. Student tickets cost less than \$40 per day after the discount.

By now you should have started hearing about this "SoutheastCon" thing coming to our section—and you will hear a lot more about it in the next six months. But what *is* IEEE SoutheastCon 2020? And why is it important to all of us in the IEEE Eastern NC Section?

SoutheastCon is the annual regional conference for IEEE Region 3 (Southeastern US and Jamaica). It consists of three conferences in one: A major paper conference of over 200 refereed research papers in a diverse collection of topics; a major student conference attended by approximately 400 students and advisors from over 60 colleges and universities across the southeast; and the annual meeting of the leaders from the over 40 local sections (such as ours). Added to our conference in 2020 will be a two-day industry conference that will cover topics in robotics, AI, embedded systems, Internet of Things, and cybersecurity! This conference will bring close to 1000 engineers, researchers, and students to the Raleigh Civic Center March 12-15. And we are the hosts for all those great folks!

And this is where you and I come in... this conference has been hosted by local sections in the region each year since 1965. Our section hosted it in 1975, 1985, and 1995–but not for the last 25 years(!). It is our time again! And there is a lot for us to do.

We have a core team in place to get this process started and they are working hard to get things going but we need more of our roughly 3000 members to get involved. There are opportunities for people who want to take leadership positions in key areas as well as things that can be done with a minimum of time and effort. Key areas that we need help with at the moment are: Logistics, sponsors and exhibits, volunteer coordination, and help with putting together the industry event. But there are smaller jobs we can use help with–can you give us a hand? We are in the heart of the land of Southern Hospitality–let's be great hosts and chip in together to make IEEE SoutheastCon 2020 in Raleigh a rousing and **FUN** success!
